Accessing In-Home Care

What Are The Options?

- Private Pay
- County Offices of Aging
- Medicaid
 - MLTC (NYIA)
 - Agency Care
 - CDPAP
 - TBI Waiver
 - NHTD Waiver

Medicaid Home Care Options - Once Approved for Medicaid Services

There are different kinds of Medicaid programs one can choose from, including:

- Managed Long-Term Care (MLTC)
 - Personal Care Services Program (PCSP)- Agency model
 - Consumer Directed Personal Assistance Program (CDPAP)
- 2. Nursing Home Transition and Diversion Medicaid Waiver Program (NHTD)
- Traumatic Brain Injury Waiver (TBI)
- 4. Program for All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE)





NYIA - What is NYIA?

New York Independent Assessor (NYIA)

Required for New York State Medicaid applicants who want to receive community-based long-term services and supports after financial eligibility has been approved by local Medicaid office.

Who Are They?

Registered nurses who conduct a community health assessment (CHA)

Independent Practitioner Panel (IPP) composed of physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants who conduct clinical appointments and issue practitioner's orders for personal care and other services based upon their examination of the applicant

NYIA - Step 1 - Community Health Assessment

- NYIA will conduct one Community Health
 Assessment (CHA) which will be used to develop a
 plan of care for each Medicaid enrollee.
 - CHA is completed by a nurse hired by NYIA who is not familiar with Medicaid applicant
 - CHA can be completed either virtually or in person
 - Assesses applicant's ability to perform Activities of Daily Living (ADLs)
 - Walking, Feeding, Dressing, Toileting, Bathing, Transferring
 - THRESHOLD Applicant must require assistance with at least 2 ADLs or require assistance with 1 ADL if dementia is present





NYIA – Step 2 – Medical Exam and Practitioner's Order and Plan of Care

- Following the Community Health Assessment, the applicant must complete a Clinical Assessment which is an appointment with a member of the Independent Practitioner Panel.
- Applicant's doctor is <u>not</u> used:
 - To order or authorize personal care
 - Or to recommend a plan of care or number of hours needed for care
- Instead, the Services must be ordered by a qualified, independent practitioner (Medical Doctors, Doctors of Osteopathy, Nurse Practitioners and Physician's Assistants) selected by NYIA



NYIA - Step 2 - Medical Exam and Practitioner's Order and Plan of Care

- Panel will determine if the individual is self-directing or has an appropriate self-directing other, and if the individual can safely receive PCS/CDPAS at home based on their medical stability
- Following the clinical assessment- an outcome notice will be sent by NYIA which informs the applicant whether or not they have been approved or denied the ability to obtain in-home help.
- Applicant will then enroll with a Managed Long Term Care Company (MLTC) or will contact local DSS office to begin the development of a plan of care.



Step 2A - For Most - Enrollment in MLTC

- Following CHA and CA, most applicants will contact a MLTC that services their geographic area and be re-assessed by a nurse employed by the MLTC
 - Assessment uses same UAS tasking tool used during the CHA completed by NYIA where the applicant's abilities to complete ADLs is examined
 - Following completion of assessment, MLTC will award a number of hours that MLTC will provide to the new enrollee.



NYIA - Step 3 - Independent Review Panel (If Necessary)

Additional medical review

- Required the first time an authorization for PCS/CDPAS services exceeds 12 hours per day, on average
- Medical review will be conducted by an "Independent Review Panel" (IRP) established by the NY Independent Assessor (NYIA).
 - Reviews:
 - Individual's community health assessment
 - Practitioner's Order
 - Plan of Care
 - Tasked with determining whether the applicant is capable of <u>safely</u> remaining in the community




Independent Review Panel

- Following their review which is conducted on paper, not in person, the IRP can recommend changes in scope, type, amount or duration of services
- IRP <u>cannot</u> specify a recommended number of hours

The Reality: Disappointing Results

- Delays in processing initial application
 - Applications timelines not being honored due to lack of staff in many local DSS Offices
- Difficulty in scheduling CHA or CA within 14 day period following call to NYIA
- Lack of sufficient hours to provide appropriate level of care





If Your Client Has "Immediate Needs"

Application can be filed with local Medicaid office, requiring:

- Complete Medicaid application
- Attestation of Immediate Need
- Signed Physician's Order for the in-home services
 - Result Medicaid to be authorized within 12 calendar days following submission of application
 - NYIA completes the Community Health Assessment and Clinical Assessment but local DSS completes plan of care and MLTC enrollment is delayed until after plan of care is instituted
