

OBBBA Impact for New York

Key Points:

Projected Annual Loss:

New York is expected to lose \$13 billion-\$15.4 billion per year in federal Medicaid funding due to OBBBA cuts

Coverage Impact:

Up to **1.5 million New Yorkers** could lose Medicaid coverage—more than doubling the state's uninsured population

OBBBA Impact for New York (cont.)



Hospital & Providers:

\$8 billion in direct losses to NYS

hospitals and health systems

- ~34,000 hospital jobs and ~29,000 associated community jobs at risk
- ~\$14.4 billion in lost economic activity statewide

Home Care Programs: Implications

Home Care Rollbacks:

Less funding may mean fewer covered hours or tighter eligibility for PCS, CDPAP, MLTC—compounded by new ADL standards.

Ripple Effect:

Hospitals under pressure will cut back referrals, community-based home care supports, and capacity—heightening risks for seniors and disabled individuals.

State Liability Shifts:

As federal support shrinks, New York may be forced to allocate state funds or cut services in other domains (e.g. childcare, education)

New policy issued by NYS Department of Health raises the bar on MINIMUM NEEDS REQUIREMENTS

- Applicant is required to need assistance with at least THREE "Activities of Daily Living" - ADLs - for "Limited assistance with physical maneuvering" to be eligible
- Up from TWO ADLs




Taking effect on September 1, 2025.





Alert: Eligibility Rule Change (cont.)

- Individuals with Alzheimer's disease or dementia:
 - Requires SupervisoryAssistance with TWO(2)ADLs to qualify







Eligibility Rule Change:

WHO DOES THIS APPLY TO?

- Medicaid recipients seeking INITIAL assessment for :
 - Personal Care Services (PCS)
 - Consumer Directed Personal Assistance Services (CDPAS)
- To enroll in Managed Long-Term care (MLTC) plans
- Also applies to their reassessments





What If You Qualified BEFORE 9/1/25?

- Individuals assessed by NYIAP prior between Sept. 1, 2024 &
 Sept. 1, 2025 and who enroll in MLTC plan or are authorized by
 by local DSS within 1 year of theirs assessment, OR
- Those who are continuously enrolled in MLTC;

9/1/25 including PACE

- ARE GRANTED "LEGACY STATUS" aka Grandfathered In
- NOT SUBJECT TO MINIMUM NEEDS REQUIREMENTS
 - Applies to those enrolled in PCS, CDPAS, or MLTC before



What About the 30 Month Look Back?



Medicaid Home Care Lookback and Transfer Penalty enacted in 2020: NOT YET IN EFFECT

NYLAG:

Cannot happen <u>until</u>:

- 1. CMS approves NYS' spending of "American Rescue Plan funds
- Letter issued by CMS in approx. July, 2025
- 2. CMS approves State Plan Amendment of the Medicaid Plan

(cont.)



What About the 30 Month Look Back?

...NYLAG: Cannot happen until:

- **3.** CMS approves DOH's request to amend the 1115 waiver to allow a lookback
- Currently Pending
- 4. DOH issues directives to local Medicaid agencies
- Has not occurred as of now.

NYS intends to implement in mid-to-late 2025, but we estimate in 2026



#3: CDPAP Class-Action Settlement & Transition Fallout

Settlement preliminarily approved in early July 2025: plaintiffs sued DOH over inadequate notice and fair hearing rights during CDPAP transition to PPL (NY's single fiscal intermediary for CDPAP)

Settlement provisions include

- court-ordered written notices
- proactive consumer outreach,
- connecting users to navigational support resources



More CDPAP - PPL Developments

- PPL Leadership Changes: former President Maria Perrin resigned.
 - CEO Change: Miki Kapoor, PPL board member is new CEO.
- Joint Senate Legislative hearing To occur on August 21, 2025
 - Outcome may influence future reform or contract reconsideration
